## 3. Jewish Holidays education and Celebration

- Family Council identified that the Recreation calendars required some sort of explanation for all Jewish references (from Challah bread to Kiddish to Oneg Shabbat etc.) in order for our broader Louis Brier community to become educated and better enjoy the various traditions.

### 4. COMPANION PROGRAM

- Financial Accounting of our program is under review. Our priority is to secure some way for companions to acquire ongoing training as the next step of the improvement process to this program

## 5. Follow up on concerns about Communication

**Referrals:** We have received feedback from nurses that there are some delays in referrals to Allied eg. dietitians. The Manager of Allied Health Services and Our Director of Care have said any referrals will have a lead time of 48 business days to respond. After the 48 hours, staff can escalate the delay to Natalie Jacobs, Manager of Allied Health Services. This was communicated to the nursing team as well through email and team meetings.

#### **Communication about Resident changes**

Communication about internal transfers (moving from Intermediate Care to Extended Care, EC to IC, IC to SCU): The Social Worker (SW)starts the conversation during admission and during the signing of the resident agreement.

Another conversation with the family will start when the interprofessional team sees a decline and expects that the clinical need will exceed where their loved one is currently at. This can happen months before(ideal) or days before the transfer if there was a rapid and significant change and a room becomes available at the same time. The conversation is lead by a nurse and/or CNLs at this point. Once a room becomes available, the social worker will contact the family and support the transfer.

In addition, SW /Natalie has an internal transfer tracking list that is reviewed by the interprofessional team every Friday during in a huddle.

- New freezer allows for sourcing of food in bulk, especially Kosher goods which can be hard to source on a regular basis
- Rachel coming back to bake for special holidays
- 7 days menu TVs in addition to the daily menu so residents can see what is coming up
- Menu under plexiglass in SCU to ensure the menu will stay up even if residents come over to touch it
- Focus on waste is a priority right now
- Focus on training and re-training and accountability in the kitchen is a priority
- Focus on servicing the requests for substitutions is a priority
