CHANUKAH: EVENING OF DECEMBER 7TH TO NIGHTFALL OF DECEMBER 8TH

This year Chanukah, the festival of lights, begins on the eve of Thursday, December 7th and ends on Friday, December 15th at nightfall. The word Chanukah means “dedication” in Hebrew and refers to the rededication of the Holy Temple. One of the most important observances during this holiday is the nightly menorah lighting, acknowledging the miracle of the oil that lasted for 8 days. Individuals celebrate this holiday by eating foods cooked in oil, such as sufganiyot (jelly donuts) and latkes, and play dreidel during this holiday season.

December 7th:

Chanukkah Performance with the Tzimmes Trio followed by lighting of the first candle, and later that evening a special performance - Chanukahspiel - The Maccabees go to Broadway: The Chanukah story in Showtunes - by Chaplain Rob.

December 8th:

Chanukah themed Shabbos and Oneg Shabbat by Cantor Steve Levin.

December 10th:

A visit and special performance by the Beth Israel Hebrew School.

December 11th:

A Chanukah Special Vigil lead by Chaplain Rob. Dreidel making for all Residents, staff, family, companions and students.

December 12:

Louis Briers Third Annual Dreidel Tournament - all are welcome.

December 13:

A Taste of Chanukah with a special performance by the Sulam Band and sufiyganots and latkas for Residents, Staff, Family, Companions, and Students.

December 14:

A special Temple Sholom Tea and Performance by Shani Cohen followed by the lighting of the last candle.

December 15:

Another Chanukah themed Shabbos and Oneg Shabbat by Cantor Steve Levin to wrap up the holiday.

Multi-Sensory Room Coming Soon!

The Recreation Supervisors have been working diligently to design and install Louis Brier's first ever Multi-sensory Room.

What is a Multi-Sensory Room anyways? It is an environment designed to arouse the primary senses in a safe space for a relaxing and enjoyable experience, where there are no intellectual requirements for participation.

Multi-sensory room interventions are well researched, evidence-based and are an alternative, non-pharmacological approach to managing some behaviours and increasing positive experiences by way of pleasantly stimulating the visual, auditory, olfactory, taste, and tactile functioning of Residents.

These interventions also offer an alternative to programming for those Residents who are unable to fully participate in traditional type activities. Residents can just relax and be, taking in the magic of their surrounding.

We have created a space that has incorporated both a land and sea experience with pleasant visualizations, sounds, smells, and textures. The multi-sensory room houses a variety of sensory items including: fiber optic lights, a faux living wall, colourful fish in our glowing fish tank, projectors with starlight visualizations/nature images, Bubble tubes, aroma therapy diffuser, and a variety of tactile items, etc.

We look forward to our grand opening schedule for January. More details to come!

HAZZAN ROB MENES

Chanukah begins on Thursday evening, December 7th. While the best known of the Jewish holidays by the general public, it is not the most important to the observance of the religion. There are few requirements, and it is filled with food, song, and joy. However, it is also filled with meaning.

Chanukah is a holiday celebrating the outward expression of Judaism. We are exhorted to publicize the miracle of the lights and be joyous for eight days. In the midst of darkness, in the midst of winter, we say 'light the lights.' It is a statement of defiance. Surrounded by other cultures and other traditions, we say 'we are here.' We will shine our light and we will not be quiet.

Although Chanukah is the Festival of Lights, it really is the celebration of the resistance to assimilation and the rededication of the Temple during the time of Greek rule over Israel. It is the time to reclaim the joy of the Jewish traditions. Jews are not alone in struggling to maintain values and traditions, but our history enables us to resist oppression wherever it may be.

Louis Brier Home and Hospital and the Weinberg Residence stand as testaments to both the resistance to assimilation, and acceptance of the reality to adapt. As the only Jewish long term care facility in Vancouver Coastal Health, we stand as the light and the hope. We are a Jewish home, yet we embrace people of all faiths and we care for them physically and spiritually. Our strength - our values - does not depend on separation or exclusion. It thrives on the ability to help all people and demonstrate what repairing the world means.

Let us all celebrate Chanukah and appreciate the freedom to express our spirituality fully!

VIRTUAL VISIT


Book your Virtual Visit

Please, use the link <https://louisbrier.com/virtual-visit/> and follow the instructions on our website. We encourage families and friends to visit their loved ones in person at LBHH, and the Virtual Visit Program is focused on supporting those living in faraway cities, provinces and countries.

Each Virtual Visit is 15 minutes long with 5 minutes in between so staff can relocate between rooms and nursing units.
